In this song, Maria teaches the children how to sing the notes of a scale.

The notes of a scale can be called by their solfège names, which are:

Do Ré Mi Fa Sol La Ti Do, but Maria uses a HOMOPHONE of each note to help the children remember:

Do: doe

Ré: ray


Mi: me

Fa: far

Sol: sew

La: La

Ti: tea



Doe: a deer, a fe - male deer. Ray: a drop of gol - den sun.



Me: a name I call my - self. Far: a long, long way to run.



Sew: a need - le pul - ling thread. La: a note to fol - low "sew."



Tea: a drink with jam and bread, that will bring us back to Doe!
